Iowa Republican Caucus Voter Survey November 2023

Overview

This report contains the results of a Civiqs survey of 432 likely Republican Caucus attendees in lowa from November 10-15, 2023. The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Sampled individuals were emailed by Civiqs and responded using a personalized link to the survey at civiqs.com.

Likely Republican Caucus attendees are respondents who answered that they would "Definitely" or "Probably" attend the Iowa Republican Caucuses scheduled for January 2024 in a screening question, and who identified themselves as Republican or Independent on a previous Civigs survey.

Demographic data was collected in previous Civiqs surveys. The survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, party identification, and congressional district to be representative of the population of likely Republican Caucus attendees in Iowa. The general design effect due to weighting is 1.57. The survey has a margin of error of \pm 5.9% at the 95% confidence level, accounting for the design effect. All survey results in this report are reported as percentages.
